### Wing Luke wins design awards

The Wing Luke Asian Museum, designed by Olson Sundberg Kundig Allen Architects, received awards in two national design competitions: a Great Places award and an interior design award.

The 2009 Great Places award is given by the Environmental Design Research Association, Places: Forum of Design for the Public Realm, and Metropolis magazine. Seven projects in architecture, planning, landscape architecture and urban design won awards. Wing Luke Asian Museum received a Place Design award, given to a project for excellence as a human environment.

The museum is also one of six winners in the International Interior Design Association's 36th annual interior design competition. They were chosen from nearly 400 projects submitted in the following practice areas: commercial, education/institutional, government, health care, hospitality, residential and retail.

The museum also received a Special Merit Award in the Historical Restoration category by Associated Builders and Contractors.
